MYLES KEOGH - IRISH AMERICAN SOLDIER

Myles Keogh was born in County Carlow on the 25th of March 1840. It appears that by all accounts, the Keogh family escaped the worst of the Great Hunger. Myles did however lose some of his siblings to Typhoid fever. At the age of 20, answering the call of Irish Clergy, Myles volunteered to fight for Pope Pius IX in Italy defending his faith and religion. By September of 1860, Keogh would be a 2nd Lieutenant in the Battalion of St. Patrick as he engaged in the Battle of Castelfidardo in Italy. The Papal Army was defeated and Keogh was soldierly appearance, and I was captured. Although imprisoned in Genoa, he was quickly released. Upon his release he would travel to high ranking officers it is clear Rome and be honored to wear the green uniforms of the Company of St. Patrick's division of the Vatican Guard. During this time he would be awarded the Pro Petri Sede Medal for gallantry.

By 1861 the American Civil War was raging. United States Secretary of State William Seward was seeking experienced European officers to serve in the ranks of the Union Army. Archbishop of New York, John Hughes (discussed in a previous article) travelled to Italy to meet with prospective recruits. Keogh meet with Bishop Hughes and decided to accept a commission as a Captain in the United States Army. Mainly serving in the cavalry, Keogh would find himself engaged in some of the Civil Wars fiercest battles. Having already fought in two pivotal Papal war engagements, Keogh would fight in such American battles as Bull Run, Antietam, Gettysburg, and Brandy Station to name a few.

On every occasion Keogh demonstrated gallantry, bravery, honor, and integrity. As evident by his superior officers, Keogh was well respected. Major General John Schofield remarked "He is one of the most gallant and efficient young cavalry officers I have ever known". The commander of the Army of the Potomac, General George McClellan also held Keogh in high esteem."His record had been remarkable for the short time he had been in the army. He appeared to a most gentlemanlike man, of exceedingly glad to have him as an aide." With the respect of such why Keogh at war's end was promoted to the brevet rank of Lieutenant Colonel. Following the Civil War Keogh would remain in the United States Army and accept a commission as Captain of the 7th US Cavalry. He would accept this commission on July 28, 1866. Assigned to Fort Riley in Kansas, Keogh would command Company I of the fabled 7th Cavalry led by none other than General George A Custer.

Keogh would return to Ireland in 1874 with a seven month leave of absence from the Army. Returning in October, he would report to Fort Abraham Lincoln. Learning he would be deployed on an Indian expedition, he decided to take out a \$10,000 life insurance policy. Fully aware of the dangerous nature of this expedition into the Black Hills of Montana, Keogh would write to his friends in the Martin family in Auburn, New York. "We leave Monday on an Indian expedition & if I ever return I will go on and see you all. I have

requested to be packed up and shipped to Auburn in case I am killed, and I desire to be buried there. God bless you all, remember if I should die—you may believe that I loved you and every member of your family—it was a second home to me."

the Little Big Horn, more famously In the meantime, please check us known as "Custer's Last Stand". On June 25, 1876, Keogh, the senior captain among the five companies was wiped out with Custer that day, and commanding one of two squadrons within the Custer detachment, Keogh died in a "last stand" of his own, surrounded by the men of Company I. When the sun-blackened and dismembered were buried three days later Keogh's body was found at blackened and dismembered dead were buried three days later, Keogh's body was found at the center of a group of trooper included his two sergeants, center of a group of troopers that company trumpeter and guidon bearer. The slain officer was found wearing a Catholic medal around his neck.

Originally buried on the battlefield, Keogh's remains were disinterred and taken to Auburn, as he had requested in his will. On October 26, 1877 he was laid to rest at Fort Hill Cemetery, Auburn, New York. Inscribed on his memorial with a cross atop it reads, Sleep soldier still in honored rest, Your soldier still in honored rest, You truth and valor wearing; The bravest are the tenderest, The loving are the daring." Myles Keogh is truly an Irish, Cathol Keogh is truly an Irish, Catholic, American hero.

GAELIC CLASS

Gaelic class got off to a fantastic start in April 2017. We are very fortunate to have use of the school classroom and are sincerely grateful to the parish and the school for allowing us to hold our class there!! KCS classrooms all have computer driven interactive white boards which allow for a tremendous leap forward in terms of instruction and learning. We made use of online textbooks, video, and audio files and interactive Gaelic websites and software. For example, a picture of an object with the corresponding Gaelic word beneath it is on the interactive whiteboard. A student touches the object and the word is spoken clearly and loudly by a native speaker. The same is true for passages of text, in addition, the speed of the speaker is controlled by the student. In effect, the students truly learn at their own pace!!

We are delighted to have children and their parents and people of all ages in the same class. We all share a common bond of learning a new language in a fun and cooperative environment. Of course, our games are supplemented with reading, writing, and speaking exercises. That said, we use as many of the five senses as we are able, to absorb the meaning, pronunciation, and idiomatic use of words and

phrases. One of our most favorite methods of learning the language and culture is through song and the interactive whiteboard truly shines as a learning resource in the department! Many of our students are musical and creative even those many programs of Irish Cultural of us who are not so inclined Friday evenings at Kingston Catholic School initially, are happily drawn in to the song circle! One of our students wrote a lively poem in Gaelic.

> Some of our goals going forward are; a Gaelic language class float in Cultural Center Hudson Valley the Saint Patrick's Parade, a Gaelic choir, a Gaelic singing group, a Gaelic language radio studio at the new ICCHV in Kingston, the production of plays and short films in Gaelic and the continued production of concerts featuring guest Gaelic singers from Ireland and Scotland, and the promotion and attendance of Irish Gaelic language Summer schools in the Gaelic speaking regions of Ireland.

We are thrilled with the large turnout of approximately 12 students for our first session of class this past Spring. Many new inquiries have been made this Summer and we will likely have two classes running this Autumn. This is truly an exciting and creative movement that has boundless creative possibilities. Please think about joining us and bring your hopes and dreams with you!! Together we will achieve that which is beyond the scope of any individual. We will forge a language community and collectively become something larger any individual could create!!

Chunky Guacamole
2 plum (Roma) tomatoes, chopped
2 avocados, peeled, chopped
1/4 cup finely chopped onion
1 serrano chile, seeded, finely chopped

1/4 cup chopped fresh cilantro1 tablespoon lime juice1/2 teaspoon salt

Tacos

3 tablespoons lime juice
½ teaspoon salt
½ teaspoon freshly ground pepper
4 salmon fillets (about 6 oz each)
2 tablespoons vegetable oil
10 corn or flour tortillas (6 inch)
2 cups finely shredded red cabbage
Lime wedges

Steps
