"Mick Corcoran was his name"





Born in County Sligo, the only child of Thomas and Mary Corcoran, Michael would become an American hero. In his late teens, Corcoran joined the Revenue Police and was stationed in Donegal. As a member of the police force, his job was to look for illicit stills and distilling activities in Donegal. While still a member of the police force, Corcoran also joined the secret Ribbonman Society. This secret organization was dedicated to helping poor Irish tenants and their civil rights under British rule. Corcoran abruptly left Ireland for New York in 1849. Many have concluded this departure was due to evidence surfacing of his involvement with the Ribbonman.

Upon his arrival in New York, Corcoran worked as a manager of Hibernian Hall. It was here he would meet Elizabeth Heaney. They would shortly thereafter be married. In 1859 he would enlist as a private in the Irish 69th

Regiment of New York State Militia. Within three years Michael Corcoran would command not again take up arms against the the 69th with the rank of Colonel. It was also during this time Corcoran became involved with Tammany Hall politics. Michael Corcoran was something of a celebrity in 1860's New York. The 69th New York was ordered to legion would consist of Irish parade the regiment in honor of visiting dignitaries. In 1860 he was ordered to parade the regiment in honor of the visiting 19 year old Prince of Wales, the son of the English Queen who had presided over the Great Hunger that reduced asylum of all the oppressed of the the Irish population and caused much suffering. Corcoran issued a and a true testament to his notion statement that he "could not in good conscience order out a regiment composed of Irish born citizens to parade in honor of a sovereign under whose reign Ireland was made a desert and her sons forced into exile". This amazing act of defiance was also insubordination and a disobeying of a direct command. Anti-Catholic and anti-Irish hatred and bigotry was still very much alive in funeral. Held at St. Patrick's the United States. As a result, Corcoran was stripped of his command and court marshaled for this act. Only the outbreak of the Civil War would save Corcoran who almost certainly would have been imprisoned. The war made him an important asset to the US Army because of his ability to recruit Irish volunteers.

With the court martial dropped, Corcoran was reinstated as Colonel New York City Mayor Michael of the 69th and sent in defense of Washington. The regiment-built Fort Corcoran before engaging in action at the Battle of Bull Run in 1861. As a result of this Union defeat, Corcoran was captured and held prisoner by the Confederate

forces. Corcoran was offered parole under the condition he did South. He refused! Eventually he would be exchanged for captured Confederate diplomats and upon his release he would be promoted to Brigadier General in command of "Corcoran's Legion". The recruits and 8 Union regiments of Infantry. While in prison Corcoran would famously write "One half of my heart is Erin's, and the other half is America's. God bless America, and ever preserve her, the earth". What a powerful statement of America first. Ireland forever! Corcoran's Legion would fight alongside of General Meagher's Irish Brigade. In 1863, Mick Corcoran would be thrown from a runaway horse. He suffered a fractured skull and would die of this injury. Idolized by Irish American troops, his legacy can be summed up by reviewing the New York Times article chronicling his Cathedral on Mulberry Street, pall bearers would include General Thomas Francis Meagher. Even the New York City mayor would attend. With full military escort, the funeral procession would arrive by ferry and proceed to Cavalry Cemetery in Queens. It is here Mick Corcoran would be laid to rest.

On August 22, 2006, unveiled by Bloomberg, in Ballymote, Co. Sligo, a new memorial would be dedicated. The national monument was dedicated to New York's Fighting 69th. Around the top of the monument would read "Michael Corcoran 1827 – 1863".

Underneath the monument is a piece of steel from the World Trade Center. This steel was donated by the family of firefighter Michael Lynch, who died on September 11, 2001. Lynch's family was from County Sligo. Sláinte, Neil



PORK CHOP SKILLET DINNER



- Prep10 MIN

This pork chop skillet dinner is a weeknight meal victory. Ready to serve in under an hour, it couldn't be easier to make!

Pork chops, onion.

Ingredients

4 pork loin or rib chops, 1 inch thick (1½ lb)

¹/₄ cup Progresso[™] beef flavored broth or chicken broth (from 32-oz carton)

4 medium potatoes, cut into fourths

4 small carrots, cut into 1-inch pieces

4 medium onions, cut into fourths ³/₄ teaspoon salt

¹/₄ teaspoon pepper Chopped fresh parsley, if desired

Steps

- 1) Remove fat from pork. Spray 12-inch nonstick skillet with cooking spray; heat over mediumhigh heat. Cook pork in skillet about 5 minutes, turning once, until brown.
- 2) Add broth, potatoes, carrots and onions to skillet. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Heat to boiling; reduce heat. Cover and simmer about 30 minutes or until vegetables are tender and pork is slightly pink when cut near bone. Sprinkle with parsley.
