CONGRATULATIONS

Paul Tully has been selected by the AOH as the 2018 Grand Marshal because of his consistent and tireless work on behalf of the Irish Cultural Center Hudson Valley (ICCHV). Working with students at Ulster Community College to develop the original concepts for a building; chairing the event when the Irish Ambassador to the United States came here to support the ICCHV; submitting grant applications; planning for and attending countless developmental meetings throughout the years; and regularly supporting the many activities of the AOH and ICCHV are just some of the reasons for which Paul has been chosen.

Paul lives in High Falls with his wife of 48 years, Lauren, who is a member of the LAOH. He is very proud of his three children and six grandchildren, and of his Irish Heritage. Both of his

grandmothers were born in Ireland, coming over here as teenagers, one from Tipperary and one from Waterford. Each married a young man who had been born here, but whose parents were born in Ireland.

In 1889, immediately after arriving in the Port of New York, Paul's paternal grandmother, Mary Lynch, traveled to see her cousin in High Falls. Her cousin was a watchman for the D&H Canal Company and resided near Lock #14. Years later, after marrying and having six children, three of her children would find a home here in Ulster County.

The history on Paul's maternal grandmother's side is similar. His maternal grandmother would marry and have ten children and have a house in Rosendale. Regarding those many aunts and uncles, Paul related one story about an uncle who was a Jesuit and served as a Chaplain in WWII for the famous Fighting 69th. Father Steve Meany had been seriously wounded during the battle of Makin Island, in the South Pacific, and, in 1947, was chosen to be the Grand Marshal of the St. Patrick's Day parade in New York City.

In addition to serving on the Building Committee of the ICCHV, Paul also is very active in the community. He serves on the Board of Directors of the Friends of Historic Kingston (FOHK), and regularly conducts walking tours of both the Rondout and the Stockade National Historic Districts on its behalf.

THE HISTORIAN'S CORNER

" A FESTIVAL OF MEMORY"

As we begin to prepare for the St. Patrick's Day celebration we can again look to one of my heroes, General Thomas Francis Meagher. If you recall, Meagher, the subject of a previous article, was an Irish Patriot who became an American Civil War hero. In 1855 Meagher referred to the St. Patrick's Day parade as a "festival of memory". Religious memory, cultural memory, and of family memory. To Meagher, the parade reminded him of the old country. Of home. Today we rejoice in St. Patrick's Day as a celebration of our cultural and ethnic identity.

But when was the first St. Patrick's Day parade or celebration in America? Interestingly enough, on March 17, 1757 at Fort William Henry on Lake George, the Irish soldiers who were garrisoning the fort at this northern frontier outpost celebrated the feast day of their Patron Saint. Knowing this, the French decided to attack the fort under the suspicion that it would be caught off guard, as the men celebrated. Although this notion was correct, the garrison of the fort was able to repel this assault.

As the British gain control of North America with the end of the French and Indian War, they maintained a large fighting force, many of whom were Irish, stationed in New York. Two British infantry regiments in

particular, the 16th and 47th Regiments of Foot were primarily Irish. On March 17, 1762 we have the first recorded St. Patrick's Day parade. New York City has the honors of hosting this historic event. Every year since, this "festival of memory" parades through the city as a show of Irish pride, culture, and identity. Today across the United States and around the world millions celebrate their cultural identity and history by enjoying St. Patrick's Day.

One of New York's greatest traditions, the March 17, 1762 parade comprised mainly of Irish exiles and Irish military members. This was a time when the wearing of the green was a sign of Irish pride but was banned in Ireland itself. Ironically enough, the first recorded parade was not in Ireland, but, in New York City! Today the parade marches up 5th avenue with a review by his Eminence, Cardinal Dolan. Since its beginnings a march past St. Patrick's Cathedral hasn't changed, but, it's address has. Originally the parade marched past "Old" St. Patrick's, now a Basilica on the corner of Mott and Prince streets.

Originally organized by military units, after the War of 1812 and with the formation of the Ancient Order of Hibernians, the parade was sponsored by individual societies. But even today, the military tradition hasn't been lost. Leading the parade is the 69th New York, the "Fighting 69th", the Irish regiment. It was in 1853 that the Ancient Order of Hibernians first marched. The NYC parade has been a fixture in the city's social, political, and cultural life ever since. John T. Ridge, author of the

history of the parade indicated the parade was "to show the newly arrived immigrants as respectable citizens worthy of esteem in American society". In 1891 the AOH adopted the familiar parade route today, up 5th avenue.

St. Patrick's Day is a uniquely Irish holiday, and yet is celebrated in more countries around the world than any other national holiday. There is no corner of the globe the Irish have left unvisited, and there is none where they have settled that has been more deeply shaped than has New York. There is no denying the preeminence of New York's St. Patrick's Day parade. Last year over 400 marching bands, pipe and drum, police, fireman, and scores of others added up to 200,000 marchers with over 2 million spectators.

As we celebrate St. Patrick's Day this year, remember the words of General Meagher. The NYC parade, the oldest and longest running parade in the world is a "festival of memory". But so is our own Kingston parade, the Hooley at the Hall, and all that we do locally to remember Ireland's Patron Saint.

BETTY CROCKER RECIPES

ONE-POT LEMON-BASIL ORZO AND VEGETABLES

- Prep 20 MIN
- Total 35 MIN
- Servings 5

Lemon and fresh basil give this light-yet-satisfying dish its bright flavor, while the orzo, chick peas, zucchini and tomatoes complete

Ingredients

3tablespoons olive oil
 2medium zucchini, cut into 1/4-inch slices
 1medium onion, chopped
 2cloves garlic, finely chopped
 8oz uncooked orzo pasta (1 cup)
 1 ½ cups Progresso™ vegetable broth (from 32-oz container)

1 can (14.5 oz) Muir Glen™ organic fire roasted diced tomatoes, undrained
 1 can (19 oz) Progresso™ chick peas, drained, rinsed
 2 teaspoons grated lemon peel
 ½ teaspoon salt
 ¼ teaspoon pepper
 1 tablespoon lemon juice
 ¼ cup julienned fresh basil leaves

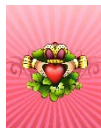
Steps

1 In 12-inch nonstick skillet, heat 1 tablespoon oil over medium-high heat. Add zucchini; cook 2 to 3 minutes, stirring occasionally, until zucchini is lightly browned. Transfer zucchini to plate.

2 Add remaining 2 tablespoons oil, the onion and garlic to skillet. Cook and stir 2 to 3 minutes or until softened. Add orzo; cook and stir 2 to 3 minutes or until orzo is lightly toasted. Stir in broth, tomatoes, chick peas, lemon peel, salt and pepper. Heat to boiling; cover, and reduce heat to low. Cook 8 to 10 minutes or until most of liquid has absorbed and orzo is almost tender.

3 Add zucchini and lemon juice to orzo mixture; stir to combine. Remove from heat, cover and let stand 3 to 5 minutes or until all the liquid is absorbed. Stir in basil, and serve.

Cooking lemon juice dulls its flavor. For that reason, we add the lemon peel early in the cooking process but save the juice for the end so it can retain its bright flavor.
